

# S.C. holds 136th Organizational Meeting

On April 1, the Village of Sea Cliff held its 136th annual organizational meeting to report on the state of the village as well as celebrate the community and its people. As evidenced by the standing room-only crowd gathered in Village Hall, it is not without the dedicated residents willing to volunteer their time and efforts in support of the community that Sea Cliff continues to be a "shining gem of the North Shore of Nassau County," as stated by Mayor Edward Lieberman in his opening remarks.

The night began with the presentation of colors and pledge of allegiance by Sea Cliff Boy Scout Troop 43. Lieberman was sworn in for a second term as the 35th mayor of Sea Cliff by Village Justice Charles Parisi.

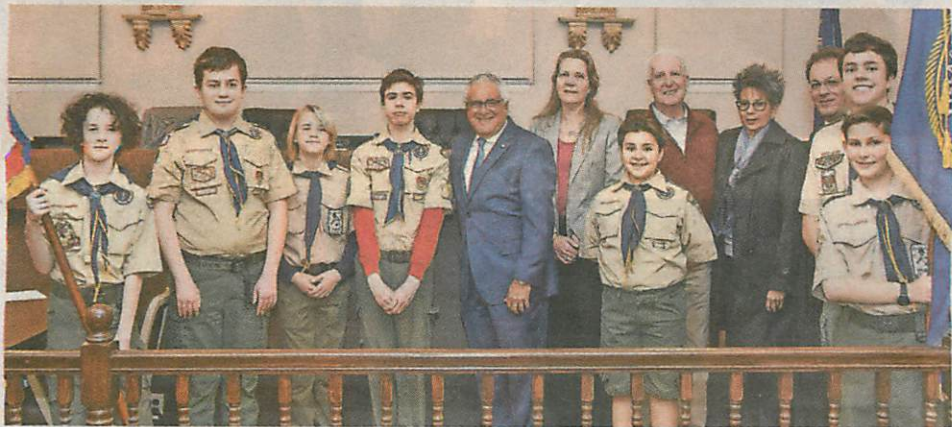
Dina Epstein and Elena Villafane were both sworn in to serve for a two-year term

The night continued with *appointments* of Sea Cliff residents to positions in all areas of village life, from Pat Guy in the continued role of Deputy Village Clerk and Deputy Court Clerk to resident Courtney Chambers in her new role as Museum Director. Over 80 village residents were appointed to positions during the remainder of the meeting.

The highlight of the evening was Lieberman's presentation to the Honorable John P. Reali, to whom the Sea Cliff Village Court was dedicated in 2018, as Judge Emeritus. The honor was received for Reali's service as a trustee from 1980-1990 as well as the Village Justice from 1990-2019.
